Sights for Hope empowers people to succeed **however they see the world.**

We provide adaptive skills training for people with limited or no vision, boost their confidence, expand their access to essential services, and help them obtain assistive devices that remove barriers to their potential. We also act to prevent vision loss by promoting healthy vision habits and connecting pre-kindergarten children with professional eye care. Most of our programs and services are provided at no cost. Founded in response to a challenge by Helen Keller, Sights for Hope has served the Lehigh Valley region since 1928 and Monroe County since 2003.

Sights for Hope is a member of the Pennsylvania Association for the Blind (PAB) and the multinational VisionServe Alliance. We also hold the maximum four-star rating from Charity Navigator, the world's largest evaluator of nonprofit organizations.

Our approach is grounded in experience, informed by evidence, and shaped by a clear understanding of what works.

Strengthen Skills

We strengthen skills that enable people with blindness and visual impairments to take control of their lives and equip our neighbors to take control of their eye health.

Deliver Supports

We deliver supports that enable people with vision loss to access essential resources, pursue opportunities, and strengthen their personal wellbeing.

Champion Solutions

We champion solutions that remove limits to human potential at every stage of life. Our specialists source assistive devices that expand the adaptive abilities of people with vision loss. Our vision screenings and community partnerships equip children to read in kindergarten.



Why It Matters

When we strengthen skills, stimulate self-confidence, deliver supports, and champion solutions, people with visual impairments and blindness are empowered to build the healthy, capable, and fulfilled lives that everyone deserves; people with eyesight are better able to preserve it; and more children can succeed in school.





Strengthening Skills

We strengthen the skills people need to live capably and confidently with blindness and visual impairments. Through structured life skills education, clients learn adaptive techniques for personal care, household management, safe travel, and effective use of technologies. Our Camp I CAN! and Transitions programs for younger clients connect them with peers and help them develop into able adults. Our peer support groups and counseling services promote emotional adjustment and resilience following vision loss. Our community education programs – including our flagship *C. Well Bunny Goes to School* program – help children and families adopt healthy vision habits for life.

Our guided transport service ensures access to medical care, food, and essential services. Our professional caseworkers identify and coordinate services, assist with mail and paperwork, teach and reinforce life skills, and perform minor home modifications that improve safety and accessibility.



Because Dignity is Not Optional

Sights for Hope faced a significant new challenge in January 2025 when state funding to help individuals obtain essential assistive devices was reduced dramatically. For many of our clients and patients, these devices are not optional – they are fundamental to safety, daily living, and the dignity they deserve.



Rather than allowing this gap to limit access, we mobilized quickly in partnership with committed donors and community organizations. With their support, we have raised nearly \$45,000 to underwrite assistive device purchases for individuals in Pennsylvania's Lehigh Valley and Monroe County.
